

GENERAL REMARKS CONCERNING THE STATE OF REPAIR

Seen from a distance, some of the panels appear contorted, without a supporting frame and in many cases, with considerable gaps.

Before proceeding to any repair work whatsoever, both the inner and the outer surfaces of the panels must be closely inspected in order to evaluate the state of conservation of each glass panel visually, and therefore, to plan a program of specific physical and chemical analyses.

During this inspection, the state of the pictorial surfaces (grisaille) must be judged whether they need spot strengthening previous to remotion. This will be necessary where the colour is completely detached from the glass, in order to avoid detachment of the grisaille during dismounting operations.

It is important to understand and locate any areas of degardation that depend on extenal factors and locate areas at risk requiring immediate fixing and/or consolidation.

Over time, small fractures have ppeared in the and leading and weldings due to mechanical stress from atmospheric agents, the weight of the glass tesserae on the leading and natural wear and tear atmospheric from atmospheric agents.

As a consequence, the panels are bent to a dangerous extent and must be checked and, where necessary, repaired.

In general the internal surface of the panels present accumulations of dust, candle grease and smoke, as well as oxalates and other substances deposited

over time. As well as impeding the light from entering, this matter has produced a tear effect in the grisaille and in places it does not adhere well; morover, it retains moisture and encourages the development of microrganismi.

The definitive restoration project will have to evaluate all these issues and problems with specific analyses and surveys before considering options of intervention.

GENERAL INFORMATION ON THE RESTORATION METHODOLOGIES:

Given the condition of the stained glass windows, as detailed below, during the process of restoration, it will be necessary to replace the unrecoverable laths <u>IN</u> <u>ALL THEWINDOWS</u> and soft-solder the others.

<u>A global restoration/intervention will require careful dismounting and securing</u> of the stained glass panels from the windows and placing the pieces in specially prepared crates.

Before removing the glass panels, any broken tesserae must be backed with adhesive tape to fix them in place.

On reaching the laboratory, they must all be photographed both "recto" (from the inside) and "verso" (from the outside). Photographic documentation must be continuous throughout every stage of restoration work, and where necessary, specific analyses concerning the state of degradation be carried out as and when appropriate or neccessary.

Following this, a graphic survey (scale 1:1) of the pattern of the leading in every panel, must be traced on paper.

Wherever it is excessively damaged or irrecoverable, The leading in the glass panels is to be removed and replaced. Wherever the leading does not provide adequate support to hold the glass tesserae, it must be replaced. This must be done using a previously-prepared graphic survey of the lead pattern.

Leading *added to* or *overlaid on* the original to repair broken panes of glass (and which often makes it difficult to "read" the original because directly placed over it) may be completely or partially removed and directly substituted or new glass may be bonded over the original.












